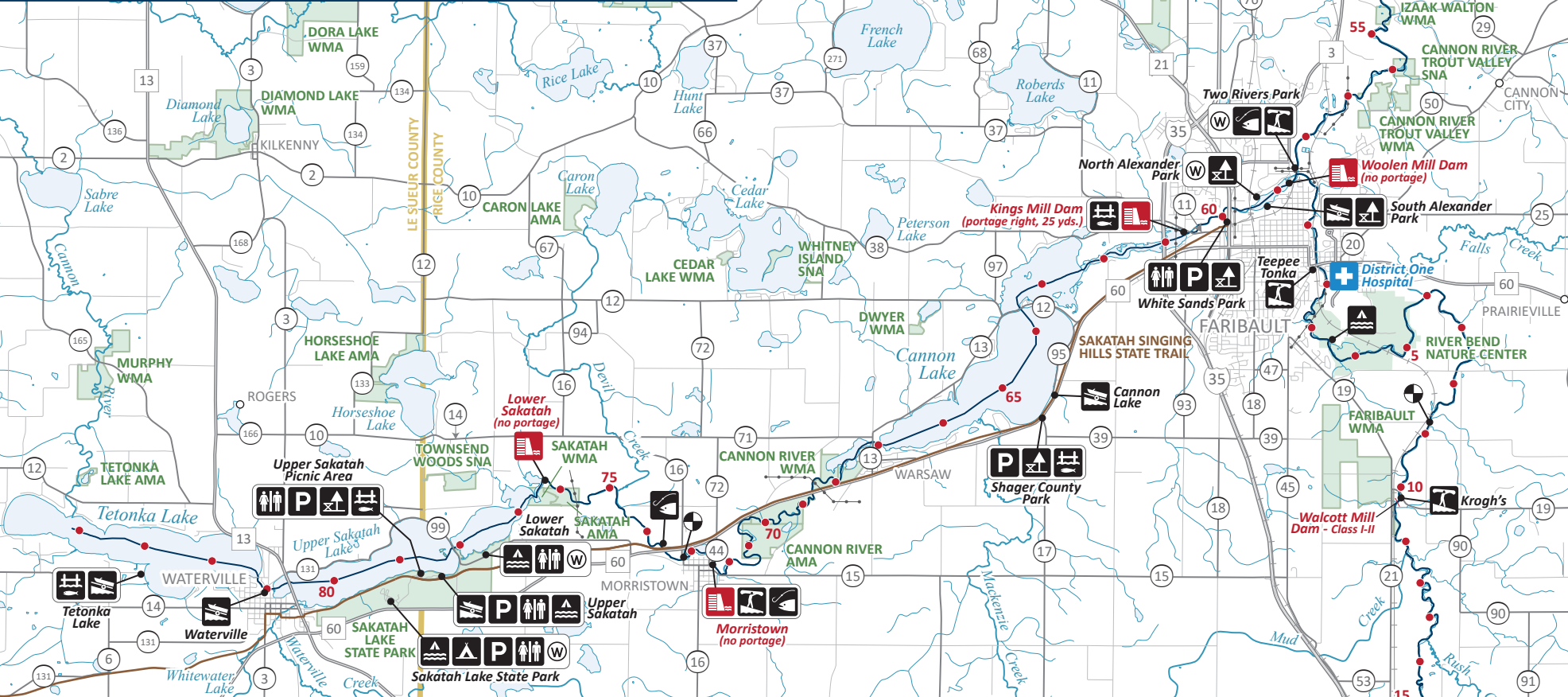
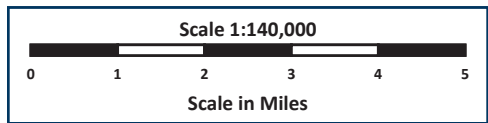


CANNON RIVER STATE WATER TRAIL
MAP 1 - Tetonka Lake to Dundas
(Includes the Straight River)

- Carry-in Access, Trailer Access, Parking, Hospital/Clinic, Restroom, Rest Area, Fishing Pier, Shorefishing, Campground, Watercraft Campsite, Dam, Drinking Water, State Public Lands, River Level Gauge, Power Lines, Rapids, River Miles, WMA = Wildlife Management Area, SNA = Scientific and Natural Area, AMA = Aquatic Management Area



Route Description

R and L represent sides of the river facing downstream.

CANNON RIVER RM 84 to 44

- 83.0 (R) Tetonka Lake trailer access and fishing pier.
81.0 (R) Waterville trailer access on Sakatah Lake.
80.7 State Highway 13 bridge.
80.4-77.2 (R) Sakatah Lake State Park. The park has remnants of the "big woods," a forest of elm, oak, walnut and other hardwoods. The park has campgrounds with drinking water, a rest area at river mile 79.3, a fishing pier at 78.9, a trailer access at mile 78.4 and a watercraft campsite at 77.8. Fee for camping and parking. "The Narrows" at County Road 99 bridge.
78.0 Sakatah Wildlife Management Area.
76.4 (R) Lower Sakatah Lake Dam. 6 feet high. No developed portage. Powerline crosses the river.
75.8 (R) Sakatah Aquatic Mangagement Area.
74.9 (L) Confluence with Devil Creek.
73.4 Highway 60 bridge. Along with an old railroad bridge, now used for Sakatah Singing Hills State Trail. Shorefishing.
73.0 County Road 16 bridge. River level gauge. Town of Morristown.
72.5 Morristown Pond Dam. 8 feet high. County Road 44 bridge is just downstream. No developed portage. Fishing pier at dam.
72.4 (R) Carry-in access.
71.1-69.8 Cannon River Aquatic Management Area.
70-66 Cannon River Wildlife Management Area.
68.8 Highway 60/Sakatah Singing Hills State Trail bridge.
68.5 Power line.
67.1 (R) County Road 13 bridge. City of Warsaw. Enter Cannon Lake.
64.8 (R) Shager County Park. Fishing pier and rest area on the southeast shore of Cannon Lake along State Highway 70. Trailer access at 64.6. It has picnic tables, shelter, toilets and swimming beach.
County Road 12 bridge. Enter Wells Lake.
63.5 Interstate 35 bridge. Power line crossing.
60.9 Powerline crossing.
60.7 (L) Kings Mill Dam. 17 feet high. Portage on left. City of Faribault.
60.6 County Road 11 bridge.
60.0 White Sands Park. Rest area and restrooms.
59.9 Highway 21 bridge. Hulet Avenue bridge and powerline crossing immediately downstream.
59.7 Railroad bridge.
59.3 (L) North Alexander Park. Rest area with water.
59.3 (R) South Alexander Park. Rest area, trailer access, drinking water.
58.8 Woolen Mill Dam. 12 feet high. No developed portage.
58.7 Second Avenue NW bridge.
58.5 Two railroad bridges.
58.5 Confluence with the Straight River. The Cannon's largest tributary is wider than the Cannon here. Shore fishing.
58.4 (L) Two Rivers Park carry-in access. Powerline crossings.
57.5 Railroad bridge.
57.0 Powerline crossing.
56.0 Cannon River Trout Valley Scientific Natural Area.
54.5 Izaak Walton Wildlife Management Area.
52.9 County Road 29 bridge. Powerline crossing. River level gauge.
52.0-47.5 Cannon River Wilderness Area. A Rice County facility with hiking trails, campsites and other facilities. The river is flanked by wooded bluffs.
50.6 (L) Wilderness Area Access and campsite. Toilets, picnic shelter and tables, fire rings and drinking water.
50.5 (R) Watercraft campsite.
49.8 (L) Watercraft campsite. Powerline crossing.
49.5 (L) Watercraft campsite.
46.5 (L) Confluence with Wolf Creek.
46.1 Highway 3 bridge. Powerline crossing.
45.2 (R) Dundas City Park. Carry-in access, rest area, picnic shelter, tables, drinking water, fire and rings. Cannon River Aquatic Management Area.

- 45.0 Mill Park. At (L) Rest area, restrooms, drinking water. Carry-in access at (R). County Road 1 bridge. The river splits around a large island. Town of Dundas, Archibald Mill.
44.4 (R) Cannon River Regional Park. Rest area.

Interstate 35 bridge. Powerline crossing.

29.1 (R) Kohlmeier Lake trailer access. Fishing pier. The lake accesses the river. Golf course bridge just past lake entrance.

27.2 (R) Morehouse Park. Trailer access and rest area.
26.9 (R) Owatonna Dam. Portage on right.
26.8 Railroad/Bridge Street bridge. River level gauge.

26.4 Railroad bridge. Powerline crossing.
26.1 North Street bridge.
26.0 (R) Confluence with Maple Creek.
24.6 County Road 34/26th Street bridge.
23.2 36th Street bridge. Powerline crossing.
22.4 Railroad bridge. Powerline crossing.
21.8 (L) Clinton Falls. Class II-III rapids. Portage left, 30 yards.
21.4 50th Street bridge.
20.8 (R) County Road 45 carry-in access.
20.8 (L) Confluence with Crane Creek. Clinton Falls Dwarf Trout Lily Scientific and Natural Area.
18.0 County Road 12 bridge.
17.1 (R) Medford City Park. Trailer access, rest area, toilets and water available. City of Medford.
17.0 County Road 45 bridge.
16.5 Railroad bridge. Powerline crossing.
16.0 (R) Confluence with Medford Creek.
15.1 270th Street East/County Road 98 bridge.
13.6 (R) Confluence with Rush Creek.
11.2 (L) Confluence with Mud Creek.
10.2 Class I-II rapids from old Walcott Mill Dam.
10.1 (R) Kroghs Landing carry-in access. County Road 19 bridge.
8.8 227th Street East bridge. River level gauge.
7.8 220th Street East bridge.
6.9 Large glacial boulder in center of river.
6.0 (R) Confluence with Falls Creek.
