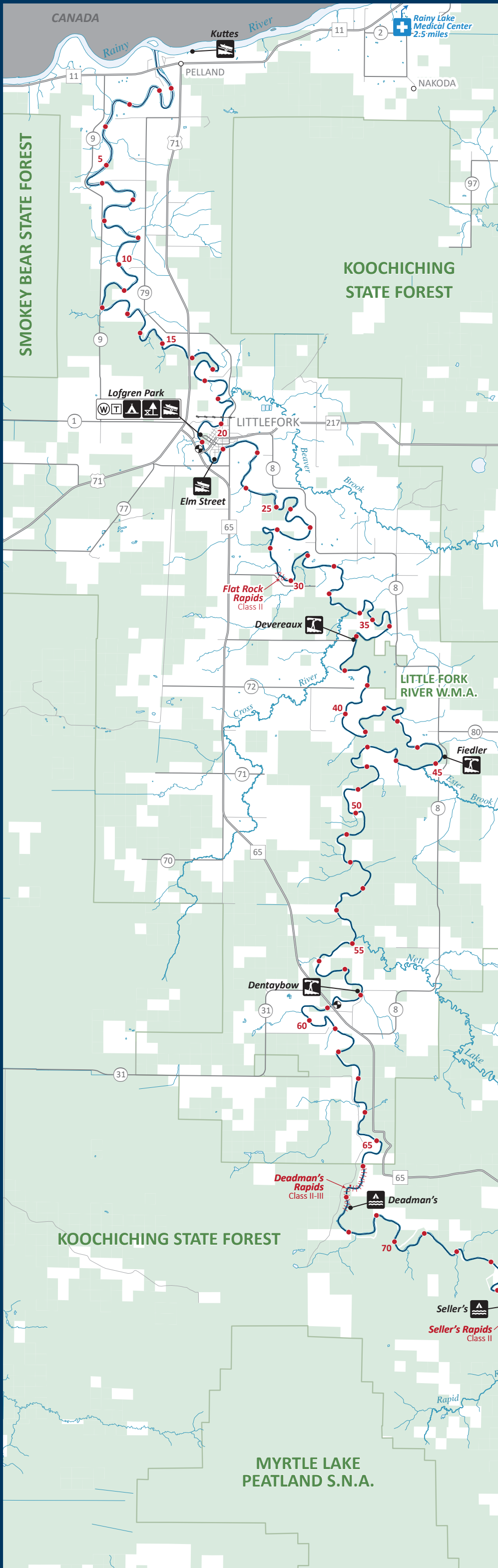


LITTLE FORK RIVER STATE WATER TRAIL

ROUTE DESCRIPTION

NOTE: (R) and (L) represent right and left banks of the river when facing downstream.

- 84.2 (L) Confluence with Gardner Brook.
- 76.0 (L) Confluence with Rapid River.
- 74.7-74.3 Seller's Rapids. Class II - III, depending on water level. Portage left, 150 yds.
- 74.5 (L) Seller's Watercraft Campsite.
- 67.2 (R) Deadman's Watercraft Campsite.
- 67.3-66 Deadman's Rapids. Considerably less difficult than its name implies, this Class II-III stretch washes out in high water. Portage right, 75 yards. Campers take out at the big piece of ledge rock in river for 200 yard portage. Portagers hug the right shore past the ledge rock for a shorter portage and to avoid portaging through campsite.
- 58.9 State Highway 65 bridge. River level gauge.
- 57.9 (L) Dentaybow carry-in access. Just off Township Road 36.
- 54.8 (R) Confluence with Nett Lake River.
- 45.3 (R) Confluence with Ester Brook.
- 44.8 (R) Fiedler carry-in access.
- 39.3-36.5 (R) Little Fork W.M.A.
- 37.1 (L) Devereaux carry-in access.
- 33.6 (L) Confluence with Cross River.
- 29.8 Flat Rock Rapids. Class II, no developed portage.
- 21.6 (R) Elm Street trailer access.
- 21.2 State Highway 217 bridge. River level gauge.
- 20.8 (R) Lofgren Park. City campground with trailer access, toilets drinking water and picnic shelter. Fee charged for camping. River level gauge. City of Littlefork.
- 19.9 Powerline crossing.
- 19.3 (R) Confluence Beaver Brook.
- 18.4 Former Burlington Northern railroad trestle location.
- 15.9 U.S. Highway 71 bridge.
- 0.4 Highway 11 bridge.
- 0.0 Confluence with Rainy River. Kuttles trailer access available one mile east on the Rainy River.
