



MISSISSIPPI RIVER STATE WATER TRAIL

Procedure for Using Navigational Locks


- #### 1. Lockage Signals

Traffic signals inform the boater of the lock's status. Signal for entrance to the lock by pulling the cord on the guide walls.
- #### 2. Traffic Signals

 - Red Light**
Do not approach
 - Yellow Light**
Approach lock
 - Green Light**
Enter lock

No Light
Lock in use, approach guide wall and signal for lockage
- #### 3. Locking Through

Wait for the lockmaster's signal before entering. Proceed into lock and move towards the mooring lines spaced along the lock wall. **The lines should be held by hand.** Remain seated and keep hands inside the boat to avoid the chance of injury. Once the doors open, proceed forward.

893-887.8 Mississippi River Islands SNA.

885.5 (R) Otsego Co. Park: Carry-in access, rest area with picnic facilities, drinking water, toilets.

883.5 (L) Babcock: Trailer access, rest area with picnic facilities, drinking water, toilets.

879.6 (R) Dayton: Trailer access. North Fork Crow River confluence.

878.9 (L) Roadside Park: Carry-in access, rest area, drinking water.

875.9 (L) Mississippi W. Regional Park: Trailer access.

875.8-875 Foster Island/Cloquet Island: 3 campsites accessible by river only (no fee).

873.4 (R) Donie Galloway Riverside Park: Rest area.

873.3 (L) Mississippi River Community Park: Rest area.

871.4 (L) Rum River Confluence.

871.4 (L) Peninsula Point Park: Trailer access, rest area with picnic shelter, restrooms, drinking water.

871.1 (R) Mississippi Point Park: Trailer access, rest area, fishing pier.

866.4 (L) Coon Rapids Dam Regional Park: Trailer access, rest area, restrooms.

866.2 (R) Mississippi Gateway Regional Park: Rest area.

866.2 **Coon Rapids Dam:** portage left 400 yards.

862.9 (R) River Park: Trailer access, rest area, restrooms.

861.9 (L) Manomin Park: Carry-in access, rest area with picnic facilities, restrooms. Rice Creek confluence.

861.5-860.7 Islands of Peace Park: Rest area with picnic facilities, restrooms.

861-860.5 **Durnam Island Rapids:** Class I Rapids. Rest area (R).

860.3 (L) Riverfront Regional Park: Trailer access, rest area, restrooms.

858.5 (R) Kroening Interpretive Center: Carry-in access.

860.4-857.6 (R) North Mississippi Regional Park: Trailer access, rest area, drinking water.

857.8 (R) Shingle Creek confluence.

855-853.5 St. Anthony Falls Historic District (see inset).

854.9 (L) Boom Island Park: Water access, rest area with picnic facilities, shorefishing, drinking water, restrooms.

854.8 (R) Bassett Creek: Carry-in access. Bassett Creek confluence.

854.6-854.1 Nicollet Island. Main channel runs right. **Caution:** The left channel takes you within 50 feet of the upper falls. **STAY AWAY!**

854.4-853.1 (R) Portage around lock and dam closures, 1.5 miles. Take out at Flaggpole Plaza, and put in at Bohemian Flats (see inset).

854 Upper St. Anthony Falls lock and dam: **Permanently Closed.** Exit the river upstream of the lock.

853.7 Stone Arch Bridge: Second oldest railroad bridge on the Mississippi River.

853.5 Lower St. Anthony Falls Dam: Lock is on right.

853.1 (R) Bohemian Flats: Carry-in access, rest area, drinking water, restrooms.
